

**11 Martinscroft Metrolink to Peel Hall Metrolink**

This route goes along mainly residential streets and through urban parks but with a raised semi-rural section at the edge of Wythenshawe with great views over the city. It passes through a number of other small parks linked by residential areas, finishing at Peel Hall Metrolink.

**12 Peel Hall Park to Northenden Riverside Park**

This route goes through residential streets, public parks and green spaces, through the restored Rose Hill Wood and 19th village centre to finish at Northenden Riverside Park on the Mersey.

**13 Northenden Riverside Park to Fletcher Moss Park**

A riverside walk following the Trans Pennine Trail along the banks of the River Mersey from Northenden Riverside Park to the beautiful Fletcher Moss Gardens in Didsbury.

**14 Fletcher Moss Park to Chapel Street Park**

This route goes through residential areas and takes in eight parks and open green spaces, ranging from formal urban parks and playing fields to a local nature reserve.



The Manchester Green Trail is a walking circuit made up of 14 routes which connect many of the beautiful green spaces and tree-lined streets around the city.



**1 Chapel Street Park to Clayton Park**

A diverse route connecting urban green spaces with beautiful woodland, a disused canal, a canal towpath and finishing with a historic building surrounded by a moat.

**2 Clayton Park to Boggart Hole Clough**

This longer route takes in a mix of urban/suburban areas and green space. The walk crosses the River Medlock, visits Brookdale Park, follows part of the Rochdale Canal, goes through Broadhurst Park and finally finishes in Boggart Hole Clough.

**3 Boggart Hole Clough to Heaton Park Metrolink**

A pleasant walk through parks starting at Boggart Hole Clough and finishing at Heaton Park. On the way the walk passes through several smaller urban parks and Blackley Cemetery.

**4 Heaton Park Metrolink to Queens Park**

This walk takes in Heaton Park and goes through Blackley Forest and other urban parks to reach Harpurhey Ponds and finishes in the historic Queens Park.

**5 Queens Park to Ardwick Green**

This urban route showcases some of Manchester's historical industrial architecture and housing alongside modern high tech commercial and residential architecture. It then follows the link between the Rochdale and Ashton Canals before joining the Lower Medlock Valley, and finishing at Ardwick Green.



**6 Ardwick Green to Whitworth Park**

This route through goes from Ardwick Green, close to the city centre, through modern residential housing, and small urban parks, past Victorian villas. It goes through Platt Fields Park and finishes at Whitworth Park with the award winning Art Gallery.

**7 Whitworth Park to Alexandra Park Café**

This short walk starts in Whitworth Park and goes through the residential area of Moss Side including passing two small parks which provides a welcome patch of green in a heavily built up area. It finishes in the restored Alexandra Park with its delightful café.

**8 Alexandra Park Café to Chorlton Bus Station**

A pleasant walk starting at the café in Alexandra Park. It follows Chorlton Brook through Hough End Clough and Chorlton Park, finishing at Chorlton Bus Station.

**9 Chorlton Bus Station to Southern Cemetery**

This route is largely off road giving almost a rural feel to it with an abundance of wildlife. It follows Chorlton Brook and the River Mersey to Chorlton Water Park and a loop through Southern Cemetery.

**10 Barlow Moor Road to Martinscroft Metrolink**

This route goes around Chorlton Water Park, through Kenworthy Woods and into Wythenshawe Park. It finishes at Martinscroft Metrolink after leaving Baguley Park.
