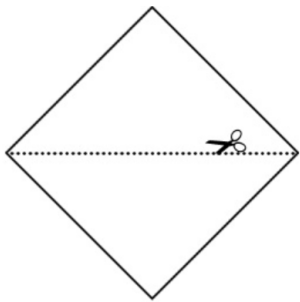
Time to Get Crafty

We all love seeing the bees visiting the flowers in the garden on our walks. Buzz...Buzz...

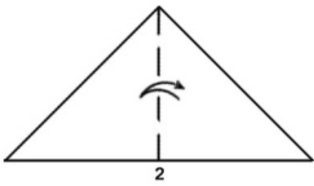
If its too windy or rainy it is difficult to spot bees, as they shelter till the sun comes out. This guide shows how to make some bees so you can see them everyday!

You will need:

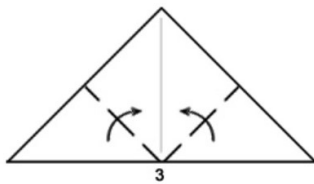
Paper, scissors, colour pens or pencils.



1. Start with a square sheet of paper that is yellow on one side (colour in this side if you want) and white on the back side. Cut it in half along the diagonal to get an isosceles triangle.

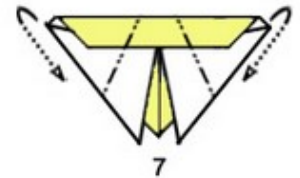
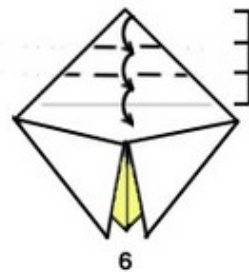
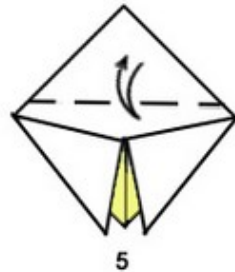


2. Fold in half and unfold.



3. Fold up the two bottom corners, meeting at the top of the triangle.

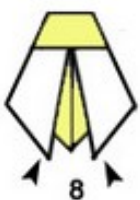
4. Fold the two corners back down, folding them at a slight diagonal angle so they are away from the centre—like the wings of a bee.



5. Fold down the top of the triangle; not exactly in half, too just above halfway. As shown in figure 5. Then unfold.

6. Fold down the top section of the triangle into thirds meeting up with crease from the fold you made in step 5.

7. Fold back the left & right sides underneath, up to the dotted line shown in image 7.



8. Fold the tips of the wings a little so its not pointy.



9. You can now colour or decorate your bee any way you like!
